




FINANCIAL UPDATE

In the year up to 31st August 2022 Swindon Town Community Mutual Ltd (TrustSTFC) made a surplus of £42,663, and we finished the year with a bank balance of £129,571.

TrustSTFC, or its registered name 'Swindon Town Community Mutual', is regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA), and we follow rules laid down by Supporters Direct (SD), which are again registered with the FCA. We are a Community Benefit Society (CBS).

Rules approved by the Financial Conduct Authority (Jan 2020): Supporters

One of those rules say we must hold an AGM within 7 months of our Financial Year end (31st August), and audited accounts must be submitted to the FCA within this time period (i.e. by the end of the following March) along with an AR30, which lists all the Trust board members as at the AGM. We also must be solvent to trade, so we always have money in our bank account.



As we currently turnover less than £100,000, we are allowed to appoint an Independent Assessor to audit our accounts, who must have Accounting qualifications. This gets voted on at each AGM. If we were to turnover in excess of £100,000, we would have to pay for a full audit by a set of accountants.

AUDITORS ELECTION



The Trust's 2021/22 accounts have been audited by independent assessor Andrew Flesher and are accepted as a true record of the Trust's financial activities.

Independent Assessor Resolution:

- Background: The Trust can "disapply" the need for a full audit of it's accounts and use the services of a suitably qualified Independent Assessor to review the Annual Accounts.
- In order to continue to use the process of an Independent Assessor rather than a full audit a resolution must be passed at the AGM to enable this process.
- The resolution is that TrustSTFC appoint a suitably qualified Auditor/Independent Assessor in accordance with the Co-operative and Community Benefits Society Act 2014 s.385 of the Companies Act 1985.




^ We've sustained the financial support on Sensory packs



DON ROGERS STATUE UPDATE

Last year we introduced the idea of statues at the County Ground, starting with **Don Rogers** on a base that commemorates not just Don but the whole team and the 1969 Cup Final win

As part of our commitment to seek feedback and approval on any large expenditures, we asked members to complete an initial survey.



Over 340 votes were cast, and a massive majority of 94% voted in favour of commissioning this first statue. Lots of additional feedback was taken on board with most respondents preferring the idea of an 'action' pose of Don rather than a 'static' pose with a trophy.



DON ROGERS STATUE UPDATE

Following the vote, we pushed forward with a design based on Don in his most famous moment, having rounded Bob Wilson and a split second away from scoring the third and final goal at Wembley on that great day in 1969.



Our sculptor **Alan Herriott** then created a small-scale Maquette, which we shared with the membership. The statue presents a good likeness of Don but given the small scale, it's only really there to allow for discussion and fine-tuning of the pose (to give some indication of scale, his head on the maquette is the size of an egg)


DON ROGERS STATUE UPDATE

In December we gave an update on our latest membership survey:

77% wanted to see a 125% scale statue 84% wanted a granite base rather than brick 58% wanted the statue closer to the stadium

We also had lots of very helpful comments around the design, these were all passed on.

Alan completed his Manchester United commission in November (this will be unveiled in May) and work started on our statue on 1st December 2022, with the creation of an armature on which the statue is being constructed.



DON ROGERS STATUE UPDATE



Alan is committed to the project and held his fee to £20k for creation of the clay sculpture over 3 months, based on a 125% scale (the bronzing is estimated to be around £40k, although TBC)

Although we ordered a 125% scale, he has based Don on a 6ft figure and told us it will therefore be visually closer to a 150% scale, and now he has added the clay he feels it will be an impressive size (nearly 7ft). The additional bronzing costs for this unplanned increase in size are being generously covered by Alan.

The image on the right is from the very early stages, with the figure being carved out of polystyrene initially.

DON ROGERS STATUE UPDATE

Alan still has a lot to do on Don's statue before he is happy with it, and we have given feedback and photos to help with a facial likeness.

When a statue gets to this stage, progress slows right down because of the level of detail and finish required.

Once signed off as satisfactory, Powderhall Bronze Foundry will then begin the mould making process prior for casting into hot bronze. This process should in April and target completion of the bronze is end-of-June 2023.

It's still a little too early to agree a site location in Swindon, plus we also need to confirm the base arrangement and get planning permission. That might mean the statue remains in the foundry for a period while we get those details sorted.




In January, the Membership gave a resounding YES to the County Ground purchase.




